CAMP MANAGER'S CORNER

My family and I have now been here at Camp Emmaus for one year. And I'll admit that there is much about this landscape at camp that I have not fully explored yet. So much of my time on the property



has more to do with work than with the opportunity to truly be present to the abundant beauty of creation around me. And I look forward to discovering the hidden gems and niches that I've yet to unearth.

In doing so, I am scouting for a "green couch" location. The green couch is a place to be present to what is happening in the landscape, both externally and internally. It's a place for contemplation, worship, naturalist training, journaling, scripture reading and simply being present to God's Spirit amongst creation. For me it means cultivating and tending to that space in a way that allows me to be prayerfully attentive to what God's Spirit might be speaking to me. It must be a space that is inviting and yet conjures up the mystical and otherworldly. Wherever it ends up being... there will be a bench and a natural threshold, and a prayer labyrinth/circle. It will be a space where I can "green" my soul when I notice my spirit is drying up.

This isn't just a dream for me, but also for the land here at camp. I envision that we would have more intentional, designated prayer spaces (green couches) scattered throughout the property. Places for rest, renewal, release and reliance on the Spirit. A little sanctuary within a sanctuary. We have a few of those space already (lakeside sanctuary/altar, 'come meet God" bench, peace pole, new council circle) and I'm excited to see how we might tend to those little sanctuaries together to enhance the Emmaus experience by continuing to "green" up the souls of all who encounter God in this blessed sanctuary.
